ABRUZZO

Abruzzo's average annual wine production of 300 million litres (5th in volume among the regions) includes 35% DOC/DOCG and 8% IGT. Red wine accounts for 60% of Abruzzo's production.

In a nation of myriad appellations, Abruzzo offers wine drinkers refreshing clarity in the regionwide DOCs for Montepulciano and Trebbiano d'Abruzzo, which account for an abundance of good red and

white wines along with a pit of Cerasuolo, a hearty rosé.

The region, whose surface is two-thirds mountains and one-third hills, boasts highly favourable conditions for vines. Growers generally favour the predominant Montepulciano and Trebbiano, though in recent times they've planted other varieties, some covered by the DOCs of Controguerra and Terre Tollesi, as well as the nine IGT appellations. The native Montepulciano (not to be confused with the town of that name in Tuscany where Vino Nobile is made) is a vine of convincing character that has been winning admirers abroad. Among Italy's DOC-DOCG appellations, Montepulciano d'Abruzzo, with about 90 million bottles distinguished under the DOCG of Montepulciano d'Abruzzo Colline Teremane.

The rest of Montepulciano d'Abruzzo is DOC, applying to both the red wine and the cherry hued rosé of Cerasuolo. Two other subzones are noted: Casauria or Terre di Casauria and Terre dei Vestini. Much Trebbiano is based on the prolific Tuscan variety, which makes light, crisp whites of subtle aroma and flavour. Some growers work with the "true" Trebbiano d'Abruzzo. A choice few have managed to make Trebbiano of remarkable depth and texture, with a propensity to develop complexity over four or five years, sometimes more, of aging. Those wines are relatively rare.

The recently revived varieties of Passerina and Pecorino are making white wines of character in Abruzzo. IGT: Alto Tirino, Colli Aprutini, Colli del Sangro, Colline Frentane, Colline Pescaresi, Colline Teatine, Del Vastese or Histonium, Terre Aquilane or Terre de L'Aquila, Terre di Chieti, Valle Peligna. DOCG: Montepulciano d'Abruzzo Colline Teramane. DOC: Controguerra, Montepulciano d'Abruzzo (Casauria or Terre di Casauria, Colline Teramane, Terre dei Vestini), Terre Tollesi or Tullum, Trebbiano d'Abruzzo.

CALABRIA

Calabria's average annual production of 47 million litres (16th in volume among the regions) includes 19% DOC and 13% IGT. Red wine accounts for 89% of Calabria's production. Calabria, which forms the toe of the Italian boot, is a predominantly mountainous region with marked variations in microclimates between the sunny coastal hills along the Ionian and Tyrrhenian seas and the chilly heights of Aspromonte massifs and the natural park of Pollino (the highest

mountain in Calabria and also one of the largest natural parks in Europe). Two grape varieties of Greek origin dominate – Gaglioppo in red wines and Greco in whites. Calabria's best known wine is Ciro', which grows on low hills along the Ionian coast between the ancient Greek cities of Sybaris and Kroton (Sibari and Crotone today). Local legend has it that Ciro' descended directly from Krimia, the wine Calabrian athletes drank to celebrate victory in an early Olympiad.

Lately Ciro' has taken on contemporary touches as new methods of vine-training and temperature-controlled winemaking have diminished the alcoholic strength, making the wine rounder, fuller in fruit and fresher in bouquet. The classic Ciro' is red, which in the Riserva version has the capacity to age beyond a decade from certain vintages. There is also a rosato and a bianco from Greco grapes. The main vine of DOC Terre di Cosenza is Magliocco Dolce (Sweet Magliocco), from which a red wine with very long ageing (contains more malvidin than Barolo and Brunello) is obtained.

An award winning wine in international competitions. In the DOC Terre Di Cosenza, besides Magliocco, there are autochtonous vines such as: Guarnaccia, Pecorello and Montonico and last but not least a very well known sweet wine Moscato di Saracena, possibly the most prestigious among the 7 slow food presidia of Italian food and Wine. Melissa, an adjacent DOC zone, makes red and white wines similar to Ciro', but red wines from the same Gaglioppo grown at higher altitudes such as Pollino, Donnici and Savuto are lighter in body and colour. The dark Greco Nero variety is also used in certain reds of Calabria. Among the whites, the rare Greco di Bianco stands out as an exquisite but increasingly rare sweet wine; from a local variety of Greco, it has a rich, velvety texture with a citrus-like bouquet. The nearly identical Greco di Gerace is a non-DOC wine that carries the ancient place name. From the same area comes Mantonico di Bianco, a Sherry-like amber wine with hints of almond and citrus in bouquet and flavour.

Each vine in each vineyard is cultivated with the same passion and love that call to mind the values of the past, giving life to the characteristic Cirò DOC and Calabria IGT wines increasingly appreciated in Italy and around the world. Today, to continue the family tradition, all stages of production are followed with dedication by the couple Enzo Sestito and Stefania Carè.

EMILIA ROMAGNA

Emilia Romagna's average annual wine production of 660 million liters (3rd in volume among the regions) includes 23% DOC/DOCG and 37% IGT. Red wine accounts for about 55% of Emilia Romagna's production.

Emilia Romagna's wines might be considered northern Italy's most eccentric, different on the whole from those of their neighbours, often facile in style but always refreshingly individualistic. In Emilia the premier wine is Lambrusco, in frothy shades of purple to pink, made from grapes grown on high trellised vines,

mainly in the flatlands south of the Po. Romagna's wines come primarily from the native Sangiovese, Trebbiano and Albana, the variety the accounted for Italy's first white DOCG. Lambrusco is produced in volume in the four DOC zones, around Modena and Reggio, though the wine is still not well known abroad in its authentic dry style. Lambrusco, with its zesty fruit flavours and low alcohol content, matches ideally with salami and prosciutto, pizza and a range of fast food.

Vineyards in the foothills of the Apenines to the south render fun-loving whites made from Malvasia, Trebbiano and Ortrugo and zesty reds from Barbera and Bonarda, but there is a definite trend in the DOC zones of Colli Piacentini, Colli Bolognesi and Colli di Parma to make still and somewhat serious wines from such varieties as Sauvignon, Chardonnay, the Pinots, Barbera, Cabernet and Merlot.

The hills south of Imola, Faenza, Forlí, Cesena and Rimini are known for wines from the native Albana, Sangiovese and Trebbiano, all of which carry the name Romagna. Albana di Romagna, which emerged in 1987 as Italy's first DOCG white wine, is most often dry and still with a distinctive almond undertone and occasionally some complexity.

The favourite of Romagnans is Sangiovese, usually a robust red with a certain charm in its straightforward fruity flavours. But increasingly producers of Sangiovese are making reserve wine of greater depth of bouquet and flavour with the capacity to age gracefully.

Emilia Romagna has ten IGTs which account for about 35% of total production. IGT: Bianco di Castelfranco Emilia, Emilia or Dell'Emilia, Fontana del Taro, Forlí, Modena or Provincia di Modena, Ravenna, Rubicone, Sillaro or Bianco di Sillaro, Terre di Veleja, Val Tidone. DOCG: Albana di Romagna. DOC: Bosco Eliceo, Cagnina di Romagna, Colli Bolognesi (Colline di Oliveto, Colline di Riosto, Colline Marconiane, Monte San Pietro, Serravalle, Zola Predosa), Colli Bolognesi Classico Pignoletto, Colli della Romagna Centrale, Colli di Faenza, Colli di Imola, Colli di Parma, Colli di Rimini, Colli di Scandiano e di Canossa, Colli Piacentini (Gutturnio, Monterosso Val D'Arda, Trebbianino Val Trebbia) Lambrusco di Sorbara, Lambrusco Grasparossa di Castelvetro, Lambrusco Salamino di Santa Croce, Modena or Di Modena, Pagadebit di Romagna (Bertinoro), Reggiano, Reno, Romagna Albana Spumante, Sangiovese di Romagna, Trebbiano di Romagna.

FRIULI VENEZIA GIULIA



F.V.G average annual wine production of 110 million litres (12th in volume among the regions) includes 65% DOC/DOCG and 20% IGT. White wine accounts for about 60% of Friuli's production. The compact region of FVG, overlooking the northern Adriatic Sea with borders on Austria and Slovenia continues to set the pace with modern Italian white wine.

Drawing from worthy native varieties and the choicest of the international array, Friulans have applied studied vineyard techniques and avantgarde enology to the production of highly distinctive whites, as well as some eminently attractive reds. Friuli has 2 DOC

zones of outstanding class in Collio Goriziano or simply Collio, and Colli Orientali del Friuli, adiacent areas that follow the border of Slovenia from Gorizia west and northwest to Tarcento. Singled out for DOCG status are two rare and coveted sweet white wines: Ramandolo, from the Verduzzo grape grown a village north of Udine, and the legendary Picolit of Colli Orientali. Carso is a unique zone in the hills above the seaport and regional capital of Trieste. The other DOC zones called Friuli Grave, Friuli Isonzo, Friuli Aquileia, Friuli Annia and Friuli Latisana cover low hills or plains. Yet quality there can be convincing, notably from Isonzo. which rivals Collio and Colli Orientali for the class of certain wines. Grave, the region's largest and most productive zone, also produces wines of distinction. Friuli whites had long been dominated by Tocai Friulano, a variety related to Sauvignon Vert or Sauvignonasse. But a European court ruled that Tocai must use another name so as not to be confused with the Tokay of Hungay, which is the name of a wine but not a vine. Friulano was the name they reluctantly adopted, while the varieties formerly known as Tocai Italico and Tocai Rosso have become Tai and Tai Rosso. Friuli's reds were traditionally light and fruity. best to drink within two to five years of the harvest. That style applied to the predominant Merlot and Cabernet Franc, as well as to Pinot Nero and the worthy native variety of Refosco.

But many winemakers have heightened structure and nuance by blending Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and other varieties and aging the wine in oak barrels. Friulans have shown an encouraging tendency to revive varieties that had been neglected. Foremost among the legends is Picolit, a white that ranked as one of Europe's finest sweet wines around 1800, when it was favoured by the Hapsburgs and other royal families. IGT: Alto Livenza, Venezia Giulia, Venezie or Delle Venezie. DOCG: Colli Orientali del Friuli Picolit, Cialla Picolit, Ramandolo. DOC: Carso, Colli Orientali del Friuli, Collio Goriziano, Friuli Annia, Friuli Aquileia, Friuli Grave, Friuli Isonzo or Isonzo del Friuli, Friuli Latisana, Lison- Prmaggiore (shared with Veneto), Prosecco (shared with Veneto).

LAZIO



Latium's average annual wine production of 210 million litres (8th in volume among the regions) includes 50% DOC and 17% IGT. White wine accounts for more than 80% of Latium's production.

Rome's region is intrinsically linked to white wine – to Frascati and Marino and the other golden-hued bianchi of the Castelli Romani, as well as to the fabled Est! Est!! From the northern Latium town of Montefiascone

Latium's hills, favoured by ample sunshine on fertile volcanic soils, seem to be naturally suited to the production of white wines based on various types of Malvasia and Trebbiano grapes. Rome's wines, led by Frascati and Marino, were traditionally abboccato, pleasingly soft though not so sweet as to overwhelm the flavour of food. They were easy, not designed to last long or travel far. The use of low temperature processing and filtration transformed their personalities into dryer, crisper, more durable wines. Still, with only occasional exceptions, the whites of Latium are pleasantly fleshy and fruity, but not the sort to be laid away or fussed over. Their immediacy is by no means a negative attribute, as evidenced by the established world market for Frascati, followed by Marino and less publicised but worthy neighbours such as Colli Albani, Colli Lanuvini, Castelli Romani, Velletri and Montecompatri Colonna. Though some admirers argue that the richer, stronger abboccato or cannellino versions are what Malvasia is all about, most modern consumers seem to prefer them softly dry.

It may come as a surprise that Latium's first and only DOCG is the red Cesanese del Piglio. Cesanese, native to the Prenestina and Ciociaria hills southeast of Rome, makes richly flavoured dry and sweet reds in two other DOC zones: Affile and Olevano Romano. Aprilia, the reclaimed stretches of what were once the Pontine Marshes, turns out considerable quantities of Merlot and Sangiovese. The reds of Cerveteri, Cori and Velletri are based on Montepulciano, Sangiovese and Nero Buono. Aleatico makes a Port-like dessert wine on the northern shores of Lake Bolsena at Gradoli. The sweet Moscato di Terracina from southern coast was recently promoted to DOC.

LOMBARDIA

Lombardia's average annual production of 140 million litres is characterised by a high quality production with 5 DOCG, 22 DOC and 15 IGT which represent 60% of the total production.

Lombardy boasts high favourable places for vines in a region where the Alpine climate is tempered by the lakes of Garda, Iseo, Como and Maggiore in the North, and the Apennines to the South.

Francia Corta DOCG produces some of the finest sparkling wines of Europe in the volcanic hills south of Lake Iseo.

Nearly a third of Italy's bottle-fermented sparkling wine is produced in the province of Brescia, but only wines from choice vineyards in the zone qualify as Franciacorta DOCG.

Curtefranca is the DOC for other wines of Franciacorta: red from Merlot and Cabernet and white from Chardonnay, Pinot Bianco and Pinot Nero.

Valtellina's rugged slopes produce red wines from Nebbiolo (here called Chiavennasca). DOCG has been granted to Valtellina Superiore and its five sub-districts (Grumello, Inferno, Maroggia, Sassella and Valgella).

DOCG now applies to Sforzato or Sfursat di Valtellina, soaringly rich reds made from semi-dried or passito grapes.

The rare and prized sweet Moscato di Scanzo, from a village near Bergamo has recently been promoted to DOCG.

Lombardy's most productive zone, Oltrepo' Pavese, is Italy's leading source of Pinot Nero grapes for the production of sparkling wine under the DOCG of Oltrepo' Pavese Metodo Classico. Only a fraction of the wine produced annually in Oltrepo' Pavese is sold as DOC. Yet, some very good wines are made there, not only Pinots but robust Barbera, Bonarda and Oltrepo' Pavese Rosso, plus fruity white Rieslings and Moscatos.

The province of Brescia boasts a majority of the region's DOC/DOCGs: Botticino, Capriano del Colle, Cellatica, Franciacorta, Curtefranca, Garda Bresciano and the three zones that share territory with Veneto: Garda, Lugana and San Martino della Battaglia.

The land is rocky with mineral undersoil, which makes for flavoursome, persistent wines. The region's unique microclimate and dry, well-ventilated and sunny conditions make it the ideal habitat for Pinot Bianco, which is the jewel in our winery's crown.

Our Franciacorta sparkling wines are produced by only-grape method, that it means we use only grape-juice for the second fermantation and for the "dosage" at disgorging. This allow us to get riper grapes in the harvest which express in the best way the special flavour of our particular terroir.

MARCHE

Marche's average annual wine production of 95 million litres (14th in volume among the regions) includes 40% DOC/DOCG and 45% IGT. White wine accounts for 53% of regional production.

Verdicchio is the bestseller among the wines of this region. But the long-time devotion to whites no longer obscures the merits of its red, recognised in the DOCG's of Conero and Vernaccia di Serrapetrona.

The Castelli di Jesi zone, covering a vast tract of hills west of the port of Ancona, is the home of Verdicchio that decades ago made an impression abroad as a fresh flavoured fish wine in green amphora bottles. But a new style of Verdicchio has emerged as a white wine of distinguished character in standard bottles, now recognised as Riserva under DOCG. Verdicchio di Matelica, grown in limited quantities in a mountainous zone, can have more body and strength than wines from Jesi, as demonstrated in the Riserva DOCG. Some producers now make wines of such impressive depth and complexity with age that Verdicchio is increasingly ranked among the noblest native white varieties of Italy.

Verdicchio from both zones makes good sparkling wine as well, usually by the sealed tank method of fermentation, but also occasionally by the classical method in bottle. The red wines of the Marche are based chiefly on Montepulciano and Sangiovese – sometimes blended, sometimes not. The most important in terms of volume is Rosso Piceno, dominated by Sangiovese. It comes from a DOC zone covering much of the eastern flank of the region, stretching from the superiore area between Ascoli Piceno and the sea north through the coastal hills to Senigallia.

Conero, dominated by Montepulciano, has gained even more praise, thanks to the devotion to quality shown by its leading producers who have been rewarded with DOCG. The zone covers the slopes of the Conero massif south of Ancona. Two unique red wines are gradually gaining more than local reputations: Vernaccia di Serrapetrona may be either dry or sweet, but it is always sparkling. Lacrima, a local vine of mysterious origin, makes red of flavours ranging from fruity dry to mellow sweet.

Sangiovese is prominent in the northern DOC zone of Colli Pesaresi, where wines bear a family resemblance to the reds of neighbouring Romagna. Bianchello del Metauro is usually light and zesty. Esino DOC, which coincides with parts of the two Verdicchio zones, provides for red and white wines, usually fresh and fruity. The white Falerio dei Colli Ascolani, from hills around Ascoli to the south, can show the inherent class of the Pecorino and Passerina varieties.

The regionwide Marche IGT accounts for a major share of production.

The Cruciani family has been taking care of this piece of earth under the sky practicing organic agriculture for 25 years. Every day the four hectares of our vineyards enjoy the sunset behind the Apennines. We work on it the whole day, most days. When we are not among the vines, we are in the cellar or doing some paperwork. The Matelica valley is in the hinterland and is like a small Trentino in the Marche region, for its strong temperature excursions both Summer-Winter and night-day. Verdicchio di Matelica is a vine that gives a structured white wine with an important acidity, a distinctive minerality and an almond finish.

It wasn't easy at first. Luca worked as a graphic designer in a printing house and Barbara, in addition to work, had to look after three young children. Time seemed never to be enough. Planting and taking care of a vineyard is a lifestyle choice, it is a marriage with the ground. The vineyards surround the house where we live, our intention is to pollute as little as possible, we aim to leave a trace as light as necessary, in harmony with Nature. We believe in good agriculture that maintains and improves the fertility of the ground, so as to leave to future generations the possibility of producing quality food and wine. With the firm belief that true life is in Nature and in respect for the Others.

PIEMONTE

Piedmont, Italy's westernmost region with borders on Switzerland and France, is hemmed in by the Alps and the Apennines, which explains why its name means "foot of the mountain". Though it ranks only seventh among the regions in total production, Piedmont is a giant of Italian wine in every other way. Piedmont stands proud as the region with the most DOC/DOCG zones (58) and with the largest percentage of wines officially classified (86%). The region produces about 16% of Italy's DOC/DOCG wines.

Piedmont is admired above all for its red wines, led by the regal Barolo and Barbaresco. But the most popular of the region's wines worldwide is the white, sweet, bubbly Asti.

An overwhelming majority of the wines of Piedmont derive from native vines. Beyond the noble Nebbiolo – source of Barolo, Barbaresco, Gattinara, Ghemme and Roero, which are all DOCG – Barbera ranks as the most popular vine for reds, followed by Dolcetto, which is enjoyed for its mellow, round flavours. Brachetto makes a sweet, fragrant bubbly red that is DOCG as Brachetto d'Acqui. Freisa and Grignolino lead a host of local varieties in rounding out the honour roll of reds.

Piedmont is a leading producer of sparkling wines foremost among them is Asti, whose DOCG applies to both sparkling Spumante – or simply Asti – and the softly bubbly Moscato d'Asti. With an average annual output of nearly 80 million bottles, the Asti appellation ranks third in volume after Chianti and Montepulciano d'Abruzzo among Italy's classified wines.

Piedmont is also a major producer of dry sparkling wines by both the classical (in bottle) and tank fermentation methods. Alta Langa DOC applies to sparkling white, rose' and red wines made by the classic method.

Among still whites, Gavi, from the Cortese grape, shows a crisp yet elegant style that explains why admirers consider it one of the best with seafood and why it was promoted to DOCG. Smoothly fruity Arneis continues to gain ground under the DOCG of Roero, where the light, zesty Favorita is also emerging. The ancient variety of Erbaluce di Caluso makes both dry white wines, also sparkling, and the esteemed Passito Riserva that ages for five years. A revelation in white wine is the Timorasso under Colli Tortonesi DOC.



PUGLIA

Puglia's average annual wine production of 700 million litres (2nd in volume among the regions) includes about 12% DOC and 19% IGT. Red and Rose' wines account for slightly more than half of Puglia's production.

Puglia is now bringing its wines to a new high standard of quality. Knowns as the 'cellar of Italy', it produces wines that have been well known since

ancient times (circa 7-8th century B.C.), the time of Magna Graecia.

Under the Romans, Apulia wines were exported around the civilised world. In the days of the Renaissance, Lorenzo il Magnifico found them most acceptable, and after the French occupation of Italy, huge quantities were shipped to France.

In recent years the region has seen a large-scale renovation of its wine sector. Steady improvement in quality along with an increase in quantity of classified wine (including the six IGT categories) has led to a growing reputation for wines widely appreciated for value abroad.

Puglia can be divided roughly in two viticultural sectors by a hypothetical line crossing the region between Brindisi and Taranto. To the north, the terrain consists of plains and rolling hills where the climate is temperate. Dry wines from this area tend to have moderate strength, with impressive fruit, good acidity and ample bouquet. Red wines generally derive from the native Uva di Troia or Bombino Nero, as well as Montepulciano and Sangiovese. White wines are dominated by the Verdeca variety, though Bianco d'Alessano, Malvasia, Trebbiano and Bombino Bianco are also evident.

South of the Brindisi – Taranto line lies Salento, a peninsula of low, rolling hills that extends between the Adriatic and Ionian seas to the easternmost point of Italy. Though hot, Salento is not quite torrid, thanks to the play of sea currents and breezes that waft across the Adriatic from the Balkans. Salento's traditional wines were the powerful, inky reds from Primitivo, Negroamaro and Malvasia Nera, but increasing attention is being given to fresher reds and rosés, as well as to some unexpectedly bright and fruity white wine.

SICILIA



Sicily's average annual wine production of 635 million litres (4th in volume among the regions) includes about 4% DOC/DOCG and 25% IGT. White wine accounts for some 70% of Sicily's production.

Contrasts are not the least of those things in which Sicily abounds. So perhaps it is not surprising that this ancient island boasts one of Italy's most dynamic wine industries or that a region noted chiefly in the past for strong and often sweet amber Marsala and Moscato has put new emphasis on dry, modern

wines - both red and white.

Sicily's rising status is reflected in the promotion of Cerasuolo di Vittoria to DOCG. That pale but potent red from Nero d'Avola and Frappato is recognised as Cerasuolo di Vittoria Classico from around the town of Vittoria.

A major share of Sicily's DOC production is represented by Marsala, a wine originated by English merchant traders two centuries ago. The other DOC wine made in quantity is the pale white, bone dry Bianco d'Alcamo, part of the broader Alcamo appellation. Moscato di Pantelleria, from the remote isle off the coast of Tunisia, is among the most esteemed of Italian sweet wines. Malvasia delle Lipari, from the volcanic Aeolian isles, is a dessert wine as exquisite as it is rare. Production of the other traditional DOCs – the dry, red Faro and the sweet Moscatos of Noto and Siracusa – has been slight in recent times, but the volume of premium wines has increased with the addition of DOCs from various parts of the island.

The greatest surge in volume of quality wine has not come with DOC/DOCG – which still represents only about 5% of total production – but with the rapid expansion of IGT, primarily under the region wide Sicilia appellation.

Many fine wines come from native varieties, notable Nero d'Avola (or Calabrese), Nerello Mascalese and Perricone (or Pignatello) among the reds, and Inzolia and Grecanico among the whites. Also prominent are such international varieties as Chardonnays, Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Syrah.

TOSCANA

Tuscany's average annual wine production of 292 million litres (6th in volume among the regions) includes 62% DOC/DOCG and 26% IGT. Red wine accounts for about 85% of Tuscany's production.

Florence's region remains the nation's most dynamic producer of premium wines. Tuscany's modern renaissance is wine began in Chianti, in the central hills around Siena and Florence, but it rapidly spread

to take in the strip along the Mediterranean coast that was not previously noted for vineyards.

Tuscans continue to excel with classical reds based on the native Sangiovese vine – Chianti, Brunello di Montalcino, Vino Nobile di Montepulciano, Carmignano and Morellino di Scansano – all DOCG. But success with other reds (especially those known as "Super Tuscans") has been augmented by new styles of whites to enhance the region's reputation.

Chianti, still the dominant force in Tuscan viniculture, is produced in seven distinct zones and adjacent areas that cover a vast territory of central Tuscany around the original core of Chianti Classico, which has a DOCG of its own. What Chianti has in common with all of the traditional red wines of Tuscany is its major grape variety Sangiovese.

The production of upscale alternative wines, which began as a trend, became an essential factor in the general improvement of Tuscan reds. Cult wines known as "Super Tuscans" continue to prosper and rank among the most esteemed and expensive red wines of Italy.

Until recently, Tuscan whites rarely enjoyed prestige, probably because most of them consisted of the pedestrian varieties of Trebbiano and Malvasia. Recently, whites of depth and complexity have been produced in Tuscany, made from such varieties as Chardonnay, Sauvignon Blanc and Pinots, all of which are finding comfortable environments in cooler parts of the regions' hills.

The pride of many a Tuscan winemaker is the rich Vin Santo, which has become DOC in many zones around the region. Most Vin Santo is made from white varieties, mainly Malvasia and Trebbiano, though the type called Occhio di Pernice comes from red wine grapes.

Tenuta Licinia sits at the foothills of the Tuscan Appenines near the village of Lucignano on the border between the province of Siena and Arezzo. The property consists of 60 hectares of woods, 5.5 Ha of vineyards and 3Ha of Olive groves. The vines were planted in 2007 by Jacques de Liedekerke and the winemaker is now James Marshall-Lockyer, his grandson, who works alongside Julien Lavenu from Bordeaux. The winery produces small selections of wines on different qualities of subsoils. The vines were only planted on a small area where the subsoil is galestro, the subsoils type Jacques rated most highly. Since the nature of the subsoil changes in the area around the vineyards, we will never expand the production of the wine beyond its current limits James has decided to continue this subsoil based approach and has begun developing a new Sangiovese cru project. After looking at the subsoils of over 100 vineyards and olive groves in the local region, he finally identified a small parcel (1.5Ha) that he believes can produce exceptional territorial sangiovese wines. The guiding approach of the winery is to identify small parcels with world class potential that have been forgotten or overlooked. VENETO

Veneto's average annual wine production of 810 million litres (1st in volume among the regions) includes about 30% DOC/DOCG and 60% IGT. White wine accounts for about 55% of Veneto's production.

Four of Veneto's wines rank in the top ten for volume among DOC/DOCG appellations: Conegliano-Valdobbiadene (Prosecco) fourth, Soave fifth, Valpolicella sixth and Bardolino tenth.

Venice's region has solidified its position as Italy's largest producer and exporter, as well as the leader in volume of classified wines. Heading the flow is Verona's famous trio of Soave, Bardolino and Valpolicella, augmented by the rapid rise in prominence of bubbly Prosecco.

Veneto has three main areas of premium wine production:

- the western province of Verona in the hills between Lake Garda and the town of Soave;
- the central hills in the provinces of Vicenza, Padova and Treviso;
- the eastern plains of the Piave and Tagliamentoriver basins long the Adriatic coast northeast of Venice.

Verona's classic wines are bona fide natives. Soave from Garganega and Trebbiano di Soave, is usually dry and still, though sparkling and sweet Recioto versions are also prescribed. Valpolicella, made from a blend of Corvina, Rondinella and Molinara grapes, is noted as a hearty red to drink relatively young, though grapes from its vineyards in the hills north of Verona can also be partly dried and made into the richly dry Amarone della Valpolicella or the opulently sweet Recioto della Valpolicella, both DOCG. Valpolicella Ripasso is a new DOC for wine produced by the so called ripasso method in which Valpolicella is refermented with the pomace of Amarone or Recioto to gain body and strength.

Veneto shares six DOC zones with other regions: Garda, Lugana and San Martino della Battaglia with Lombardy, Lison-Pramaggiore and Prosecco with Friuli-Venezia Giulia and Valdadige with Trentino-Alto Adige.
