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Chinese Developers Shift to Lifestyle Marketing to Sell Homes

Chinese real estate vendors are abandoning traditional hard-sell advertisements in favor of creative lifestyle marketing. Developers like Xingyao Holding are producing viral social media mini-dramas filmed on-site to attract buyers, while others host multi-billion yuan art exhibitions or create pet-friendly communities. Experts note this shift reflects modern premium buyers prioritizing day-to-day living experiences over simple property specs. **(China Daily)**

China Greenlights Massive Underground Gas Storage Infrastructure

The National Energy Administration approved a major underground gas storage network in northern China. Spanning across Shandong and Henan provinces, the 18-billion-yuan (€2.33 billion) project repurposes depleted oil fields into high-tech strategic reserves. This infrastructure expansion aims to safeguard winter energy supplies for residential heating while reducing industrial reliance on high-carbon coal power. **(Infrastructure China News)**

High-Altitude Airport Expansion Completed in Yunnan

Construction crews finalized a massive runway and terminal expansion at Diqing Shangri-La Airport. Situated at an altitude of over 3,200 meters, the project required specialized concrete reinforcement to withstand extreme temperature fluctuations. The updated aviation infrastructure will dramatically double passenger capacity, enhancing regional logistics and tourism connectivity across the mountainous province. **(Aviation Week China)**

Smart Sponge City Infrastructure Rollout Expands

The Ministry of Housing and Urban-Rural Development announced that 45 major cities have successfully integrated "sponge city" infrastructure into their urban renewal frameworks. Utilizing permeable pavements, rooftop gardens, and underground rainwater harvesting networks, these engineered ecosystems are designed to prevent flash flooding and naturally recycle urban water supplies during heavy summer monsoons. **(Urban Green Journal)**

Yangtze River High-Tech Smart Highway Project Enters Final Phase

Engineers launched the final tech-integration phase on a new 150-kilometer intelligent highway stretch running parallel to the Yangtze River. The advanced infrastructure features built-in wireless charging lanes for commercial electric trucks and a dense network of 5G-connected sensors. This pilot project serves as China's blueprint for the future of automated, low-emission freight corridors. **(China Transport Daily)**
