#### **Turpan Resource Development**

Turpan boasts extremely rich coal resources, with proven reserves reaching 59.3 billion tons, accounting for approximately one-tenth of the national total. It is one of the four major coal bases in Xinjiang, designated for key national development, providing solid resource support for the development of the coal chemical and textile industries. Turpan City is committed to building a clean and efficient coal utilization industrial cluster. **(China Daily)**

#### **China's deepest offshore wind farm begins full operation**

China's deepest offshore wind power project began operation on April 7 after connecting to the grid, marking a breakthrough in the country's ability to develop wind farms in complex and deep-sea environments. The project's 42 wind turbines are located about 70 kilometers off the coast of Shandong province, with depths ranging from 52 to 56 meters. **(China Daily)**

#### **Shanghai begins construction on 350m yuan UHV power hub expansion**

Shanghai's first ultra-high voltage (UHV) power project during the 15th Five-Year Plan (2026–30) period began construction on April 3, and is expected to provide strong energy support for the city's development as an international center of economy, finance, trade, shipping and scientific and technological innovation. The completion of the project is expected to raise power supply capacity by 50%. **(China Daily)**

#### **Yantai accelerates new energy cluster with dual green industrial parks**

The inaugural phase of the green power industrial park built by Wanhua Chemical Group Co Ltd in Haiyang, a county-level city under Yantai, Shandong province, commenced operations on April 4, alongside the groundbreaking ceremony for its second phase. The event marks a significant milestone in Yantai's pursuit of green and low-carbon development. **(China Daily)**

#### **China's construction machinery exports surged 33.4% year-on-year in January and February 2026**

In the first two months of this year, China's construction machinery exports reached US\$10.686 billion, a year-on-year increase of 33.4%. Even in February, during the Spring Festival holiday, exports still exceeded US\$5.1 billion, surpassing the average monthly export value of US\$5.016 billion in 2025. In terms of product type, exports of construction machinery parts and tracked excavators saw significant increases. **(China Construction Machinery Association)**
