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MIIT-Affiliated Universities Disclose 2025 Financials as Four Top RMB 10B

All seven universities under the Ministry of Industry and Information Technology (MIIT) have released their 2025 financial statements, with four surpassing RMB 10 billion. Harbin Institute of Technology led with RMB 22.74 billion, followed by Beihang University (16.62B), Beijing Institute of Technology (16.06B), and Northwestern Polytechnical University (13.92B). Harbin Engineering University grew the fastest at 21.4%. **(Education Online)**

Unitree Robotics Debuts on A-Share Market, Accelerates University Partnerships

Unitree Robotics went public on the A-share market on August 19, with its market value surging to RMB 444.9 billion. To address an estimated talent deficit of nearly one million in embodied AI, the company has launched 15 joint industry colleges across China since December 2025, partnering with 8 undergraduate and 7 vocational institutions to secure a steady pipeline of robotics engineers and technicians. **(Sina)**

Sichuan Advances Digital Intelligence for Lifelong Learning

Sichuan Province is expanding digital intelligence to build a lifelong learning society, in details released on August 18. The region has established a five-tier network covering 144 core institutions and 1,500 learning sites, backed by a provincial credit bank. Key programs include digital resources for 9.5 million teachers and students, career training for 692,000 college students, and education for 1.83 million seniors. **(Education Online)**

Shandong Approves Establishment of Luzhong Technician College

Shandong Province approved the establishment of Luzhong Technician College in Binzhou, based on Luzhong Senior Technical School. The public institution will enroll at least 6,000 students, including 2,000 in preparatory technician programs, focusing on fields like automotive repair and electrical automation to train skilled talent. **(Shandong Provincial People's Government)**

China Opens All New Community Worker Positions to College Graduates

China's Ministry of Human Resources and Social Security issued a notice on August 19 requiring all newly recruited full-time community workers positions to be open to college graduates. To boost grassroots employment, the policy encourages community service roles and 3 to 12-month internships, while offering career pathways including potential nominations to community leadership committees. **(Sina)**
