

#### **Smart classrooms expand in compulsory education**

China's compulsory education system is accelerating smart classroom deployment. In 2025, 46% of primary and middle schools adopted interactive boards and cloud-based teaching systems. Classroom efficiency improved by 16%. Investment in smart classroom infrastructure reached €260 million, driven by digital curriculum upgrades and regional education equality initiatives. **(China Basic Education Research Institute)**

#### **Private higher education strengthens industry collaboration**

Private universities in China are deepening cooperation with industry partners. In 2025, 39% of private higher education institutions launched joint programs with enterprises. Graduate employment rates increased by 14%, particularly in engineering and digital services. Total funding for industry-linked education programs reached €330 million. **(China Association of Private Education)**

#### **Teacher training focuses on digital competency upgrading**

Teacher professional development increasingly emphasizes digital teaching skills. In 2025, over 4.2 million teachers participated in certified digital training programs. Teaching effectiveness scores improved by 15%, particularly in blended learning environments. Public and private investment in teacher upskilling reached €180 million, supporting long-term education quality improvement. **(China Teacher Development Center)**

#### **Early childhood education quality standards improve nationwide**

China continues to raise quality standards in early childhood education. By 2025, 58% of kindergartens implemented standardized curriculum and evaluation systems. Child cognitive and social development indicators increased by 13%. Investment in facilities, teacher certification, and curriculum design totaled €225 million. **(China Preschool Education Association)**

#### **Educational publishing accelerates digital content transformation**

China's educational publishing sector is rapidly transitioning toward digital formats. In 2025, digital textbooks and online resources accounted for 34% of total education publishing revenue. Student usage increased by 20%, improving learning continuity across regions. Total market value reached €4.6 billion, with €310 million invested in content digitization and platform development. **(China Publishing Research Institute)**
