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Emerging markets hot for China PV (photovoltaic)

Chinese solar panel manufacturers are shifting focus to emerging markets as growth slows in traditional regions. In the first half of 2025, China's solar panel exports to Africa surged 47.5% year-on-year, with exports to Oceania also rising 23.7%. This shift is prompting Chinese companies to invest directly in these regions, establishing manufacturing facilities and partnerships. **(China Daily)**

China revitalizes 88 key rivers, lakes in ecological restoration drive

China has revitalized 88 key rivers and lakes by the end of September under a national ecological restoration plan. Notable successes include the Yellow River maintaining uninterrupted flow for 26 years and the Beijing-Hangzhou Grand Canal being fully rewatered. Systematic rehabilitation has reversed ecological degradation in previously dry or polluted basins like the Haihe River. **(Xinhua)**

China's wind industry aims to double capacity by 2030

China's wind power industry aims to double its cumulative installed capacity to 1,300 gigawatts by 2030, according to a new industry declaration. The "Beijing Declaration on Wind Energy 2.0" stipulates annual new installations of no less than 120 GW from 2026 to 2030. This ambitious plan includes at least 15 GW of offshore wind capacity. The goal represents a massive expansion from the current capacity of 580 GW. **(CX Daily)**

New energy storage tops 100m kW

China's new energy storage capacity has exceeded 100 million kW, solidifying its global leadership. This marks a 30-fold increase since 2020, now representing over 40% of the world's total. The sector has entered a phase of large-scale development, supported by massive investment and rapid technological advancement. China aims to further foster innovation to achieve its carbon goals and support the global energy transition. **(China Daily)**

Saudi power giant chooses Chinese contractors for half of its projects

Saudi Arabia's ACWA Power has awarded 50% of its projects to Chinese contractors, citing their superior capabilities in engineering, procurement and construction. The company's China president highlighted Chinese firms' overwhelming advantages in EPC services. This partnership reflects growing confidence in China's infrastructure expertise. The collaboration strengthens energy ties between China and Saudi Arabia. **(CX Daily)**
