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Cambodia Launches New Laos Overland Route to Export Fresh Produce to China

Cambodia opened a new cross-border land freight corridor via Laos on June 22 to ship fresh farm goods to China. Four trucks loaded with Cambodian durian became the first batch of cargo on this logistics route. Transport time is cut from 15–20 days by sea to merely one week, lifting export competitiveness. **(Asiafruit)**

Bangladesh Aims to Launch Jackfruit Exports to China This Season

Bangladesh plans to sign a jackfruit export deal with China during their prime minister's upcoming visit. Officials held a virtual meeting with Chinese customs and conducted on-site orchard audits to verify quarantine compliance. Bangladesh produced 1.83 million tons of jackfruit in FY2023/24, yet only exported 2,081 tons globally. **(Asiafruit)**

China's May 2026 Wine Imports Drop 10.68% YoY to 118 Million USD

China's wine imports hit 118 million USD in May 2026, down 10.68% year-on-year, with average import price rising to 7.09 USD per liter. Cumulative imports from Jan to May reached 555 million USD, falling 5.35% YoY amid cautious procurement by distributors. Bottled wine saw broad volume declines. **(Wine Business Observer)**

China to Impose Extra 55% Tariff on All Australian Beef Imports Starting June 20

China's Ministry of Commerce issued an official notice on June 19 regarding beef safeguard measures. Australian beef shipments hit the full annual import quota on June 18, triggering extra tariff rules. An additional 55% duty will apply to Australian beef on top of baseline tariffs from midnight June 20. The tariff hike follows the country-specific quota mechanism laid out in MOFCOM's 2025 No.87 Announcement. **(China Daily)**

Myanmar Nears Avocado Market Access to China, Chinese Investors Show Strong Interest

Myanmar is negotiating a phytosanitary agreement with China's customs to officially export avocados to China. Chinese investors intend to fund Myanmar's international-standard fruit packaging plants amid active investment talks. Myanmar's fruit industry delegation visited Yunnan in June to discuss cross-border fruit trade at expos and explored cooperation on avocados, mangoes, durians and other fruits and local market access chances. **(Asiafruit)**
