By the end of last year, China's remote medical services network covered all cities and counties, extending its reach to communities and villages. China made public a guideline to facilitate and regulate the integration of AI and healthcare. Issued by the General Office of the National Health Commission and four other departments, the guideline sets out multiple goals, one of which is to make AI technologies, such as AI-assisted diagnostic imaging, available in most hospitals at the secondary level and above by 2030.
