China's JUNO Team Releases First Physics Result About Neutrino in Nature

China's Jiangmen Underground Neutrino Observatory (JUNO), home to the world's largest transparent spherical neutrino detector, has published its first findings in Nature. Based on 59 days of data collected in 2025, researchers reduced measurement uncertainties by a factor of 1.6. JUNO will also support studies of supernova, solar, atmospheric and geo-neutrinos. **(Xinhua)**

China Leads Latest Nature Index Rankings, Highlighting Growing Scientific Strength

China remained the world's leading contributor to scientific research in the 2026 Nature Index, with its adjusted share rising 22.4% from 2024 to 2025, the only double-digit increase among the global top 10. China ranked first in five research fields and accounted for 53% of global chemistry Share, underscoring its growing influence in high-quality scientific research. **(People's Daily)**
