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Beijing Token Factory Reaches 1.4 Trillion Daily Output

Beijing's first token factory for large language models has achieved a daily production capacity of more than 1.4 trillion tokens, according to local authorities. Located in Beijing E-Town, the facility integrates computing power, chips, datasets and AI models. Officials said the factory aims to expand output to 10 trillion tokens per day in the future. **(China Daily)**

Book-Type Foldables Fast Turning into Hot AI Interface

Book-style foldable smartphones are increasingly becoming key AI productivity devices, industry analysts said. Counterpoint Research forecasts global foldable smartphone shipments will grow 20% in 2026, with book-type models accounting for 65% of total foldable shipments, up from 52% in 2025. China remains the largest market, with foldable phone shipments exceeding 10 million units in 2025. **(China Daily)**

AI Boom Spurs Electronics Manufacturing

China's electronic information manufacturing industry is expected to advance from scale expansion to quality-driven growth during 2026-2030, fueled by rapid AI adoption. Revenue of major manufacturers rose to 17.4 trillion yuan (about \$2.4 trillion) in 2025 from 14.1 trillion yuan (about \$2 trillion) in 2021. China's AI investment is projected to exceed \$100 billion by 2028, boosting demand for intelligent devices and AI hardware. **(China Daily)**

Guangzhou Tech Company Rises to Meet the Demands of The AI Era

A chipmaker in Guangzhou is expanding silicon photonic production capacity to meet rising AI-driven demand in the Greater Bay Area. The project involves an investment of 25.2 billion yuan (about \$3.5 billion), adding 40,000 wafers per month capacity, with total output expected to reach 120,000 wafers monthly by 2029. The expansion supports growing needs in AI, automotive and industrial electronics. **(China Daily)**

2026 Global Digital Economy Conference Kicks Off in Beijing

The 2026 Global Digital Economy Conference opened in Beijing (2-5 July), focusing on artificial intelligence, digital talent and industrial digitalization.
