




Main strengths and opportunities of Kosovo tourism are:

Number of domestic and international visitors and nights spent



Accommodation capacities in Kosovo



The *Kosovar* daily cuisine consisting of various pies and an assortment of meat, coordinates well with the hot summers and cold winters it possesses. As a result of its continuous history involved with conflict and invasion, the cuisine of Kosovo has been developed consisting of dishes from various nationalities such as: Albanian, Serbian, Turkish, Greek, Croatian, Italian, and more.



Skills gaps in tourism

The most notable skill gaps are in the following areas:

- specialist managerial level such as hotel general manager, hotel HR manager
- high level specialisations such as in the areas of marketing, planning,
 MICE, special interest tourism such as for example wine tourism
- cultural tourism development and management, management of routes and circuits
- tour guides: general, adventure guides, guides for cultural heritage
- international standard food production and service, highly skilled chefs
- e-marketing
- ecotourism
- inbound tour operators (particularly tour packaging)
- language skills, customer service, information technology (IT)
- weak attention given to sustainability and accessibility

Innovation in tourism

There are product innovations, process innovation, management innovation, and logistics innovation.

In Kosovo Innovation basically means enriching and improving the tourist product. All participants in the tourism industry have partial responsibility for this dimension. The biggest contribution in this direction should be given by the immediate suppliers of the tourist product, in all forms of tourism (mountain, adventure, rural, balnear, ecotourism, hunting, transit ...) - that is, tourism businesses.

Kosovo has immense opportunities to orient tourism in an innovative way. There are wonderful conditions to introduce the green and environmental element, in the tourist service, with all the above models.

It is necessary to develop eco-friendly services in mountain and rural accommodation structures.

Kosovo has significant potential for the development of gastronomic tourism and in general to incorporate food into the tourism product offering. This has enormous potential to foster development particularly in the rural communities and local dishes. To intertwine traditional cuisine with modern elements and is offered in rural and mountainous destinations in addition to offering tour services.
