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Machinery Market Rebounds As May Excavator Sales Surge At Home And Abroad

In May 2026, China sold 24,800 excavators, a year-on-year increase of 36.2%, with domestic sales reaching 11,600 units (up 38.6%) and exports reaching 13,200 units (up 34.2%). Cumulative sales from January to May reached 126,800 units, a 24.7% increase. In July, domestic infrastructure equipment tenders increased significantly, with orders for electric loaders and mining trucks rising month-on-month. **(CCTV)**

New Industrial Internet Policy Released on July 1

Eight departments jointly issued "Industrial Internet High-Quality Dev Implementation Opinions". Core industry value to hit 2.5 trillion yuan (\$367.947 billion) by 2030 while in 2025 was 1.67 trillion yuan (\$245.788 billion) by 2025, aimed to set up a global-leading system by 2035, driving digital demand for machine tools, automation and construction machinery. **(Xinhua News)**

The Inaugural International Embossed Intelligent Industry Expo Was Held In Shanghai

The inaugural Shanghai International Embossed Intelligent Industry Expo was held in Shanghai from July 2 to 4 in Shanghai. Nearly 200 companies participated, and over 15,000 professional visitors attended. The expo released an industry development report, and concurrently hosted an overseas procurement matchmaking event, connecting robot buyers from Europe, America, and Southeast Asia. **(Sohu)**

Enterprise Sales Charge Ahead In Jan-April

Data from the State Taxation Administration on invoice issuance shows steady growth in the sales revenue of Chinese enterprises from January to April this year. The manufacturing sector grew by 6.9%, with the equipment manufacturing sub-sector rising by 7.6%. "New quality productive forces" demonstrated impressive performance: high-tech industries grew by 15.3%. **(China Daily)**

Unitree IPO A Boost To Robotics Sector

Unitree Robotics set a record for the fastest initial public offering (IPO) process; the company plans to raise 4.2 billion yuan (\$617.9 million) to fund humanoid robot production and AI research and development. China is home to over 140 robotics manufacturers, with over 330 models registered, and produced 14,400 units in 2025 (accounting for 84.7% of the global total). **(China Daily)**
