Involved Areas	THE WHOLE OF PENINSULA MALAYSIA, FEDERAL TERRITORY OF LABUAN, SABAH (Please Refer to SOP Sabah State Movement Control Order (MCO) AND SARAWAK (SIBU DIVISION - Please Refer to Sibu Division Movement Control Order (MCO) SOP)
Enforcement Period	22 January 2021 (starts at 12:01 a.m.) until 4 February 2021 (11:59 p.m.) * For Sarawak (Sibu Division) starting from 16 January 2021 (starts at 12.01 am) until 29 January 2021 (11.59pm)
Controlled Movement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PDRM is responsible in enforcing control over local infection areas with the assistance of Malaysian Armed Forces, Malaysian Civil Defense & RELA. The entry and exit routes of MCO areas are closed and controlled by PDRM. • All residents in the MCO areas are NOT ALLOWED to leave their homes / residences except: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Only two (2) household representatives are allowed to go out just to get food supplies, medicine, dietary supplement and basic necessities within a radius not exceeding 10 kilometers from their residence or to the nearest place from their residence if supply of necessities is not within a 10-kilometer radius of their residence; and ➤ A maximum of three (3) people including patients are allowed to go out to get health care or medical services within a radius not exceeding 10 kilometers from their residence or to the place nearest to their residence if health services or the medicine are not within a radius of 10 kilometers from their residence. ➤ Movement of private vehicles, Government departments or private companies for the purpose of going to and from work or conducting official government business is dependent on the seating capacity of the vehicle.

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GENERAL SOP FOR MOVEMENT CONTROL ORDER (MCO)

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Control Movement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students and candidates sitting for the Sijil Pelajaran Malaysia (SPM) Examination year 2020 and 2021, Sijil Tinggi Pelajaran Malaysia (STPM), Sijil Vokasional Malaysia (SVM), Sijil Tinggi Agama Malaysia (STAM), Malaysian Skills Certificate (SKM), Malaysian Vocational Diploma (DVM), Assessment Admission to Special Schools for Form 1 and Form 4 and equivalent international examinations are allowed to attend schools across MCO or CMCO or RMCO areas in accordance to the school calendar prescribed by the Ministry of Education Malaysia (MOE) with confirmation documents from MOE and movement to and from school can be accompanied by a guardian. • Matriculation colleges are allowed during the MCO period. Students in boarding schools / universities / institutions are allowed to be in the respective boarding schools / universities / institutions and continue with hybrid learning. • International examinations and professional bodies as well as research activities that require laboratories facilities in the Institutions of Higher Learning (IPT) are allowed in compliance to the SOP of the IPT and movement must be accompanied by validation by the Ministry of Higher Education (MOHE) or the relevant IPT. • Movement for the lecturers / teachers / instructors for the purpose of Teaching and Learning of classes involved in the examination is allowed with confirmation from MOE and MOHE. • Movement for admission of students to dormitories for examination classes set by MOE and MOHE are allowed with confirmation from MOE and MOHE. • Students need to obtain a movement permit letter to cross states or districts to return to campus from the respective IPT. • Movement in / out of MCO area for emergency cases such as death is allowed after obtaining permission from PDRM. • Movement in / out of MCO area for emergency cases such as natural disasters is allowed. • Natural disaster aid/ humanitarian aid movement by NGOs need permission from State Disaster Management Committee or District Disaster Management Committee and the aid must be channeled through the Disaster Operations Control Center (PKOB) under NADMA. • Control of movement in and out of Sabah during the MCO period is in accordance with the SOP of MOVEMENT CONTROL ORDER (MCO) FOR THE WHOLE STATE OF SABAH. • PCA and RGL between Malaysia and Singapore are to be continued based on the agreed agreement.

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Activities Within MCO Areas	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All activities other than those listed in the ESSENTIAL SERVICES LIST are NOT ALLOWED. • Restaurants, shops / food stalls, food trucks, roadside hawkers, circulating hawkers, food courts/ hawker centers, roadside stalls / kiosks, grocery stores and convenience stores are ALLOWED to operate between 6.00 am to 10.00 pm. • Food sale activities are only allowed for takeaway, drive-through or delivery starting between 6:00 am until 10:00 pm. • Grocery and convenience stores are ALLOWED to operate between 6.00 am until 8.00 pm • Hospitals, clinics and medical laboratories can operate for up to 24 hours or subject to terms of the license permit • Pharmacies can operate from 6:00 am to 8:00 pm. • Daily necessities shops can operate from 6:00 am to 8:00 pm. • Petrol stations can operate from 6:00 am to 10:00 pm except petrol stations located at the highway can operate for up to 24 hours. • Daily markets and farmers markets can operate from 7:00 am to 2:00 pm • Wholesale Markets can operate from 12:00 am to 6:00 am and 11:00 am to 4:00 pm. • Pet Clinics and Pet Shops are allowed to operate from 6.00 am to 8.00 pm. • Laundromats and optical shops are allowed to operate from 6 am to 8 pm • Self-service laundromat premises to ensure employees that standard operating procedures (SOPs) are complied
Permission for operation and movement for essential need	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All sectors in the list of essential services registered with the Ministry /related Agency can operate during the MCO period. Employee movement is subject to the registration / operating approval letter and employee pass / employer confirmation letter. • The movement of the official Government duties must be accompanied by an employer confirmation document. • Employee attendance capacity for essential services should be limited to employees who need to be physically present to the workplace for the purpose of performing duties and other categories of employees in the essential services can work from home. (Employers are responsible for classifying categories to reduce number of people in the workplace to the necessary rate).

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Action	Brief Description
Health Protocol	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The owner of the premises must ensure the control of the entry and exit of the premises with 1 meter social distancing • The premise owner must ensure that customers check in the premises using MySejahtera or by writing the name and phone number manually as well as scan body temperature. Body temperature 37.5 degrees Celsius and above is NOT ALLOWED to enter the premises. The owners of the premises need to ensure only customers with "Low Risk" status in MySejahtera, are allowed to enter their respective premises • The premise owner needs to limit the number of customers in the premises with a social distancing of 1 meter radius at any given time and displays the maximum number of customers in the premises. • Employees, suppliers and customers are required to wear face masks properly according to MOH recommendations while on premises. • It is mandatory to wear face mask, especially when in a crowded public place except for the following activities and places as follows: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Own residence and involves same household members; b. Private Paid Hotel / Accommodation Room involving members of the same household; c. Private workspace; d. Indoor and Outdoor sports & recreational activities; e. Own vehicles involving members of the same household; f. Indoor / outdoor areas and public places without any other individuals; and g. While eating and drinking in public

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Mosque / Surau activities and houses of worship	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For the purpose of managing the mosque / surau and houses of worship, 5 committee members are allowed to attend. • Friday prayers in the Federal Territories of Kuala Lumpur, Labuan and Putrajaya are allowed with a maximum of 30 people while the other states are subject to the State Government and the State Islamic Religious Authority.
Relaxation of Leisure Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jogging activities are allowed in groups of not more than 2 people only in the neighbourhood. • Group cycling is NOT allowed. Cycling activities alone not exceeding 10 km from the residence are ALLOWED.
Childcare Centers, Nurseries, Kindergartens and Kindergartens	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Childcare centres, nurseries, kindergartens and kindergartens are allowed to operate with the permission by the relevant Ministry / Agency. • Parents / guardians who send children to childcare centres are allowed to use vehicles with the number of child passengers according to the vehicle capacity. • Day care centre for the Disabled (OKU), Senior Citizens, Women and Various Care Centres are allowed to operate during the MCO period.

LIST OF ESSENTIAL SERVICES

(Only 30% attendance from the management team while the number of employees is determined by the employer by ensuring social distancing practices and public health protocols can be implemented in the workplace)

Manufacturing:

1. Aerospace including MRO;
2. Automotive (car vehicles and component)
3. Food, beverages and their chains;
4. Packaging and printing;
5. Household products, personal care items (FMCG - soap, personal cleansers etc.) and detergents including its chains;
6. Health and medical care including dietary supplements;
7. Personal protective equipment (PPE) and fire safety equipment;
8. Components for medical devices;
9. Electrical and electronics;
10. Oil and Gas (Oil and Gas);
11. Petrochemicals and petrochemical products;
12. Chemical products;
13. Machines and equipment;
14. Ceramics (ceramics as mold for making gloves);
15. Iron and steel;
16. Textiles involving PPE production only;
17. Furniture sector; and
18. Production, distillation, storage, supply and distribution of fuels and lubricants.

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Construction

19. Construction:

- i. Maintenance and critical repair works;
- ii. Major public infrastructure construction works; and
- iii. Building construction works that provide complete workers' accommodation on construction sites or employees placed in the Centralised Workers Quarters (CLQ).

Service

20. Automotive (Repair and Maintenance Only);

21. Financial Services and its chain:

- i. Financial Institutions (Banking, Insurance, Takaful and other licensed, formulated or registered entities by Bank Negara Malaysia); and
- ii. Capital market entities licensed, registered or regulated by the Securities Commission Malaysia.

22. Municipal and local government services:

- i. Pawnbroking/community credit (licensed moneylender company);
- ii. Management of solid/sewerage waste;
- iii. Public cleansing; and
- iv. Cleaning of premises and sanitation.

23. Telecommunications and digital infrastructure including ICT services and global business services (GBS);

24. Ecommerce and its chains include e-marketplace services, digital payments and local internet centers;

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Service

25. E-Commerce and its chains include marketplace services, payment and digital and local e-commerce internet centers;
26. Development of digital creative content in the studio including film editing;
27. Hotels and accommodation;
28. Agriculture, fisheries and livestock sectors including veterinary services:
 - i. Farm management/nest of swift birds/ horses/ animal processing plants/slaughterhouses/ livestock/ feed mills of livestock/suppliers of vaccination/management of livestock/pet stores (livestock transplant operations are at night);
 - ii. Disease control and regulated live livestock production, livestock inputs and related products livestock industry (including exports and imports); And
 - iii. Health management, diagnosis of diseases and animal treatment.
29. Utilities (water and energy);
30. Professional services (including accountants/ lawyers/ auditors/ engineers/ architects), scientific (including R&D) and technical (including maintenance);
