
# Alberta Economic & Commercial Profile

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#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- Alberta is the third largest Province in Canada by GDP, representing 20.4% of Canada's GDP (0% growth rate from 2018).
- Total trade exchange with Italy (2019): CAD 659,446, 595 billion (4.29%)
- Alberta Exports to Italy (2019): CAD 216,624, 107 (31.76%), = 6.68% of Canadian exports to Italy
- Alberta Imports from Italy (2019): CAD 442,822,488 (-5.35%), = 4.67% of Canadian imports from Italy

#### **Economic and Commercial Profile**

Alberta is the 3<sup>rd</sup> largest economy in Canada measured by GDP. It is a major energy **jurisdiction**, has the 3<sup>rd</sup> largest oil reserves, among the highest natural gas reserves in the world.

Although Alberta is a major energy jurisdiction, the Energy sector is relatively small part of Alberta's economy now. It is a diversified province, and its fastest growing sectors are not energy – but are unconventional energies – they are technology related to energy and the environment. Alberta's many capital-intensive industries, including oil & gas, create strong demand for financial services, trading, mergers, and acquisitions, insurance & fintech.







Edmonton has an advanced manufacturing ecosystem that is home to nearly 40% of Alberta's manufacturing output, specailizing in high-value manuafacturing of customized products.

Further, the Advanced manufacturing cluster has evolved away from traditional manufacturing to the development and implementation of innovative high-tech innovation.

About one-fifth of manufacturing output consists of value-added industrial products such as fabricated metals, machinery and electronics

# NATURAL RESOURCES



The minerals industry (excluding oil and gas) is vibrant part of Alberta's economy. Non-energy minerals excavated and mined in Alberta include sand and gravel, sandstone and other building stone, iron and magnetite, and gold. Salt and limestone continue to be the leading non-fuel minerals produced in Alberta. Other minerals produced or potentially available in Alberta include:

- metallic minerals
- diamonds
- ammonite
- other precious stones
- industrial minerals
- stone

Alberta has hundreds of sand and gravel pits of various sizes. Some sand and gravel are washed for placer minerals, such as gold and platinum, before being used for construction, fill and cement manufacturing.

#### FINANCIAL SERVICES

Alberta's financial sector grew by 38% between 2008 and 2018, outpacing all other provinces. Calgary is regarded as one of Canada's four global financial centres, with a cluster of 1,400+ financial services companies that employ more than 20,000 people. Calgary also has the secondhighest number of head offices per capita in Canada and Calgary firms handled 9.5% of global energy related deals between 2012 and 2016. In addition, 75% of the top 20 global investment banks have branch offices in Alberta.

## AGRI-FOODS 🎉 🕮



Alberta has one of the world's most productive agricultural economies, with a total farm area of 50.3 million acres or 20.3 million hectares.

• Alberta offers a high-quality supply of primary products and is the thirdlargest exporter of agri-food products in Canada.

In 2019, Alberta exports of primary and processed agricultural and food products totalled \$11.4 billion.

Alberta produced 32 per cent of Canadian wheat, 29 per cent of canola, 48 per cent of the nation's barley, and 20 per cent of Canada's oats.

Alberta led the nation in cattle inventory, accounting for more than 40 per cent of Canada's total.

- Alberta has an expanding value-added agricultural products sector. In 2018, sales of Alberta's processed food and beverage industry were \$14.9 billion making it Alberta's **second largest manufacturing industry** on a revenue basis.
- The addition of 2,350-square-metres of business incubation and development space makes Alberta's Food Processing Development Centre and Agrivalue Processing Business Incubator the largest of its kind in the world Source: Invest in Alberta

# OIL & GAS



Home to one of the world's largest unconventional oil deposits, the oil sands, and has the third largest oil reserves in the world. also has an abundant supply of low-emission and affordable blue hydrogen, experience in hydrogen production and leadership in carbon capture and storage.

#### **PETRO-CHEMICALS**



Alberta produces approximately 69 per cent of Canadian natural gas, primarily exporting supply to North America and Eastern Canada by pipeline.

The petrochemicals sector accounts for approximately one-third of Alberta's total manufacturing exports.

Alberta produces 27 per cent of Canada's chemical output. There is significant potential for investors who are interested in taking advantage of Alberta's vast energy resources and new government development programs to build new petrochemical plants in the province such as the Alberta Petrochemicals Incentive Program, a 10year grant program launching this fall.

#### **FRONTIER OIL SANDS MINE PROJECT**

Frontier Oil Sands project is a proposed truck-and-shovel oil sands mine located between Fort McMurray and Fort Chipewyan in northeast Alberta.

At full production, Frontier will produce 260,000 barrels per day of bitumen. Frontier is anticipating a 41-year mine life, generating long-term employment and economic activity.

#### **ASPEN OIL SANDS**

The Aspen Oil Sands project is a proposed insitu steam assisted gravity drainage (SAGD) oil sands project. Aspen would produce up to 150,000 barrels of bitumen a day, putting it among the company's largest oil sources. The output would be achieved with two phases.

#### **IMPERIAL OIL'S KEARL MINE**

Imperial Oil's Kearl Mine - Started in Q3 2015; Phase 3 completion of the project is expected by 2020. The cost of the project is \$16 billion

#### LIQUIFIED NATURAL GAS (LNG)

Alberta's natural gas has access to Asian and European markets through two to three additional mega LNG projects by 2030.

Shipping from Canada's West Coast to markets in Asia takes half the time than from the U.S. Gulf Coast (10 days versus 20), while proposed projects in Eastern Canada are six to eight shipping days from Europe, which is less than any other North American LNG projects.

#### **CLEAN-TECH INVESTMENTS**

The Clean-Tech sector includes several areas of focus, namely: transportation, energy storage, power management, agriculture and process technologies that -apply to many industries. Provincial investments in artificial intelligence, geothermal energy and information technology over the last decade was to make Alberta a magnet for investment in new technology.

Edmonton ranks 3rd in the world for Al/AM Research and Development, is home to major bio-institutes, a renewable energy resource, and material supply chain represents a sustainable base for growth in the clean technology sector or demand for their products.

The local economy is incentivized with a city rebate program to support investment in solar power homes, in addition to a city climate resilience adaptation strategy.


- -A total of 125 projects are currently under construction or planned over the next 10 years in Alberta, representing \$190 billion in investment.
- Energy projects account for more than 95 percent of the value of major project investment in the province. New energy projects have increased the total value of projects in the province from \$178 billion to \$190 billion in 2019.
- -In 2019, there were 17 clean technology projects included in the Alberta inventory, valued at \$3.2 billion.
- -These include a carbon capture and storage projects valued at \$0.6 billion, six wind projects valued at \$1.7 billion, five solar projects valued at \$0.7 billion, four biofuels projects valued at \$0.1 billion, and one low sulfur marine fuel facility valued at \$0.1 billion.
