

## HIGHLIGHTS

- Newfoundland is the 9th-largest Province in Canada by GDP, representing 1.92% of Canada's GDP (+4.0% growth rate from 2018).
- Total trade exchange with Italy (2019): CAD 475 million (+12.3%)
- Newfoundland exports to Italy (2019): CAD 501 million (-9.2%), = 15.4% of Canadian exports to Italy
- Newfoundland imports from Italy (2019): CAD 26 Million (+154.7%), = 0.27% of Canadian imports from Italy
- Trade balance with Italy: CAD +475 Million (negative for Italy)




# **NEWFOUNDLAND & LABRADOR**







Newfoundland and Labrador is home to Canada's largest ocean economy, and to one of the most diversified export markets in the country, providing unique trade opportunities for European Markets.

#### Quick Facts

Real GDP rose by 4.0% due to higher oil and mineral exports and increased levels of capital investment.

-Capital investment increased by 10.3% to \$10.0 million due to higher levels of investment on the West White Rose oil project and Vale's underground nickel mine at Voisey's Bay.

 Real exports increased by 8.6% primarily due to higher oil and iron ore shipments.


# MANUFACTURING

Manufacturing is vital to Newfoundland & Labrador's economy and to the prosperity of all. The sector directly accounts for nearly 5% per cent of provincial GDP, generates more than \$6.9 billion in annual output, and accounts for close to 9,000 jobs in 2019.

The Newfoundland and Labrador manufacturing industry produces a wide variety of products, but the majority of manufacturing output is concentrated in refined petroleum, food processing (primarily seafood), fabricated metal manufacturing, non-ferrous metal production and processing, and newsprint.

Newfoundland's manufacturing sector has the highest level of productivity and median wage in comparison to other Atlantic provinces, due to the prominence of high-value manufacturing.

# AGRICULTURE & AQUACULTURE

Currently agriculture is a \$500 million industry, employing 6,500 people during the peak season.

In general, the most established producers are dairy, poultry, livestock, egg, vegetable, and cranberry. There are emerging opportunities in fur, wine grapes, corn, soybean, and grain.

Newfoundland & Labrador is home to over 400 different farms The largest crop commodity is Greenhouse and Nursery, accounting for 6.6 per cent of total Farm Cash Receipts.

Value of vegetable production rose 0.3 per cent to \$6.6 million; the top two vegetable crops in 2019 were turnips and potatoes.

The top five crops in 2019 accounted for 80 per cent of all vegetable sales; they are as follows: potato, turnip, carrot, cabbage and beet.

#### Seafood and Aquaculture

Newfoundland and Labrador's seafood products are exported to over 40 countries, with a total market value of \$169 M for aquaculture (2019). The total value of seafood production in 2019 was approximately \$1.4B, with \$930M exported in processed seafood.




Newfoundland & Labrador accounts for 100% of Canada's total offshore production with some of the lowest GHG emissions globally. In less than 10% of the total offshore area, there is resource potential of 63.2 bbls of oil or 224.1 Tcff of Natural gas, and there are more than 650 leads and over 20 basins to explore

Mining is one of Newfoundland and Labrador's largest and oldest industries, and a major contributor to the economy of the province, especially in rural areas. More than fifteen mineral commodities have been produced or mined in the province.


Five metal mines currently produce iron ore, nickel, copper, cobalt and gold. Other operations mine pyrophyllite, limestone and dolomite, amongst other commodities. The value of Newfoundland and Labrador

mineral shipments totalled \$3.7 billion in 2019, an increase of 29.4% from 2018.









# NEWFOUNDLAND & LABRADOR: MAJOR PROJECTS & INVESTMENTS

# OIL AND GAS MAJOR PROJECTS

Newfoundland is the site of numerous worldclass industrial projects in the areas of petroleum development, mineral development, and mineral processing.

The Bay du Nord Project– the Flemish Pass. Discovered in 2013, the Bay du Nord Project is expected to be sanctioned in 2020, with first oil expected in 2025. With reserves of nearly 300 million barrels of oil, Bay du Nord is the first remote, deep water project in the province's offshore (500 kilometres from shore and approximately 1,200 metres deep). It opens a new basin – the Flemish Pass and is the first project to be negotiated under Newfoundland and Labrador's generic oil royalty regulations. The Deepwater oil project is valued at \$6.8 billion.

#### Offshore Projects and Exploration in NL Currently, four oil projects produce offshore

Newfoundland and Labrador:

- <u>Hibernia</u>, operated by Hibernia Management and Development Company Ltd.
- <u>Terra Nova</u>, operated by Suncor Energy
- <u>White Rose</u>, operated by Husky Energy
- <u>Hebron</u>, operated by ExxonMobil Canada


# **MAJOR MINING PROJECTS**

# **MAJOR ENERGY PROJECTS**

A total of 26 projects are currently under construction or planned over the next 10 years in Newfoundland and Labrador, repesenting \$30 billion in investments.

- Energy projects accounted for over 80% of the value of major projects in the province.
- In 2019, there were two clean technology project included in the Newfoundland & Labrador inventory, a hydroelectric project valued at \$10.1 billion, and a wood pellet plant worth \$20 million.
