



Red Sea International Airport












 At over 1 million square meters, our Landscape Nursery is the largest in the region and is part of our planet first approach to enriching the natural environment around us and setting new standards in sustainable development.



 It is now fully operational and in total will provide more than 30 million plants for The Red Sea and Amaala, reducing our reliance on importing foreign species of plants and instead allowing native plants to thrive. Guests can satisfy their senses by visiting the nursery through touching, smelling, and seeing beautiful and rare plants, shrubs, trees and palms.





 The project is worker-led, with local communities crucial to the nursery's development and maintenance.
Through this, we have ensured the nursery improves the unique ecology of the Kingdom and supports the local economy by providing rewarding opportunities for local Saudis.








Set in a hidden valley and nestled between the mountains, Desert Rock allows guests to immerse themselves in nature on a whole new level, while offering unparalleled luxury. 
• The village is a state-of-the-art residential and commercial area that will house around 14,000 workers, staff, and management at The Red Sea.



 Turtle Bay includes highquality corporate offices, as well as housing, restaurants and a wide range of leisure and recreational facilities. • Shura is the main hub island at The Red Sea. With a natural dolphin shape, the island is one of 92 in our archipelago and home to stunning vistas, incredible native fauna and flora, and beautiful wildlife.



• Due to open to guests in 2024, the island will house 11 world-class hotels and resorts including Edition, Fairmont, Raffles, SLS, InterContinental, Jumeirah, Miraval, Rosewood and Grand Hyatt brands. Guests will have a wide choice of experiences and attractions to enjoy, including an 18-hole championship golf course, a marina and a beach club, as well as a variety of luxury retail options.















 Six Senses Southern Dunes, The Red Sea, is one of two inland resorts. It is based around 100km northeast of the town of Umluj, a beach town on Saudi Arabia's Red Sea coast.
