## Re: Import reform - What is good for Europe is good for Israel

The new import reform, "What is good for Europe is good for Israel", has been approved in the Knesset this year. The reform is one of the most significant economic reforms ever implemented in Israel. It aims to address the barriers that persisted despite all the previous reforms.

The reform is intended to modify the existing system in the field of imports by opening new trade tracks, eliminating bureaucracy, reducing import costs, and expanding trade with the European and other markets.

According to the new reform, a product sold (marketed) in the European market which is compliant with European regulation can be sold (marketed) in Israel without the need to undergo any testing institute or meet unique requirements. The reform applies to imports in the following areas: standardization, energy, food, and cosmetics. The reform will be fully implemented in January 2025.

The reform is based on three principles:

- Adopting the European method in importing goods and relying on European regulation.
- Enforcement in the markets while imposing responsibility for compliance with the regulation on the importer.
- Removing the barriers to parallel imports and to small and medium importers.
